<b>Travelling to the UK</b>	Essential travel only according to permitted reasons	Yes. A new account function is available for regular travellers to store details & avoid entering each time. Details of hotel or test packages must be recorded on Passenger Locator Form.  Plus, Travel Declaration form to leave the UK. Mandatory from 8 <sup>th</sup> March 2021	Yes – 10 days.  "Travel testing package" to be prebooked for Day 2 and Day 8 during 10 days quarantine regardless of length of stay.	Yes, within 3 days of travel from age 11+ from 18 January . NHS tests not accepted.	From age 11 years+	If the passenger has been in a Red list country in the last 10 days, they may not travel by Eurostar to the UK. A designated point of entry must be used.
